Biblical Hermeneutics
(Core Course/Clergy Track)

Hermeneutics is an all inclusive term to mean the science or act of interpreting the Bible and presenting that interpretation in a meaningful and relevant way. This course will seek to equip the student with skills sufficient to stand between the language of the Bible and the language of the 21st century.

Introduction To The New Testament
(Core Course)

This course examines the major themes of the New Testament, including: The Kingdom of God, Jesus Christ, salvation, the church, gifts and the Second Coming. The general emphasis is to equip the student with a general knowledge of the New Testament that will be applicable for daily ministry.

Ministry In Context: The Church, The City, & The Kingdom of God

This course provides a biblical foundation for urban ministry and equips students to explore sound theological and sociological approaches to the unique challenges facing congregations in urban settings. Students will demonstrate competence in ministry strategies for biblical justice, community engagement, community development and advocacy based on the power of the Gospel to transform the culture.

Sermon Construction / Homiletics
(Core Course)

Introduction to preaching lays the foundation for biblical sermon construction and delivery. It includes: how to prepare a sermon outline, how to write a preaching manuscript, how to use biblical and theological research tools, preaching without notes, exploration of different types of sermons, a practicum assignment and how to write a Bible study and theological lecture.

(Core Course)

This course will examine the teaching ministry of the church with particular attention given to its impact in everyday life. Students will be provided with the tools for practical application of the Word of God. The course will explore models for a variety of situations and current trends in Christian Education.

Finally, the course will explore the theology, terminology, development, organization and practice of worship and church music.
